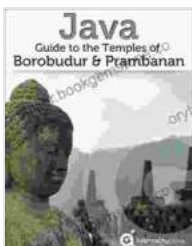

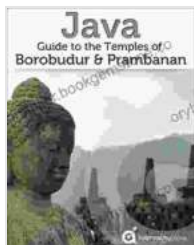
Accommodation and Transportation
