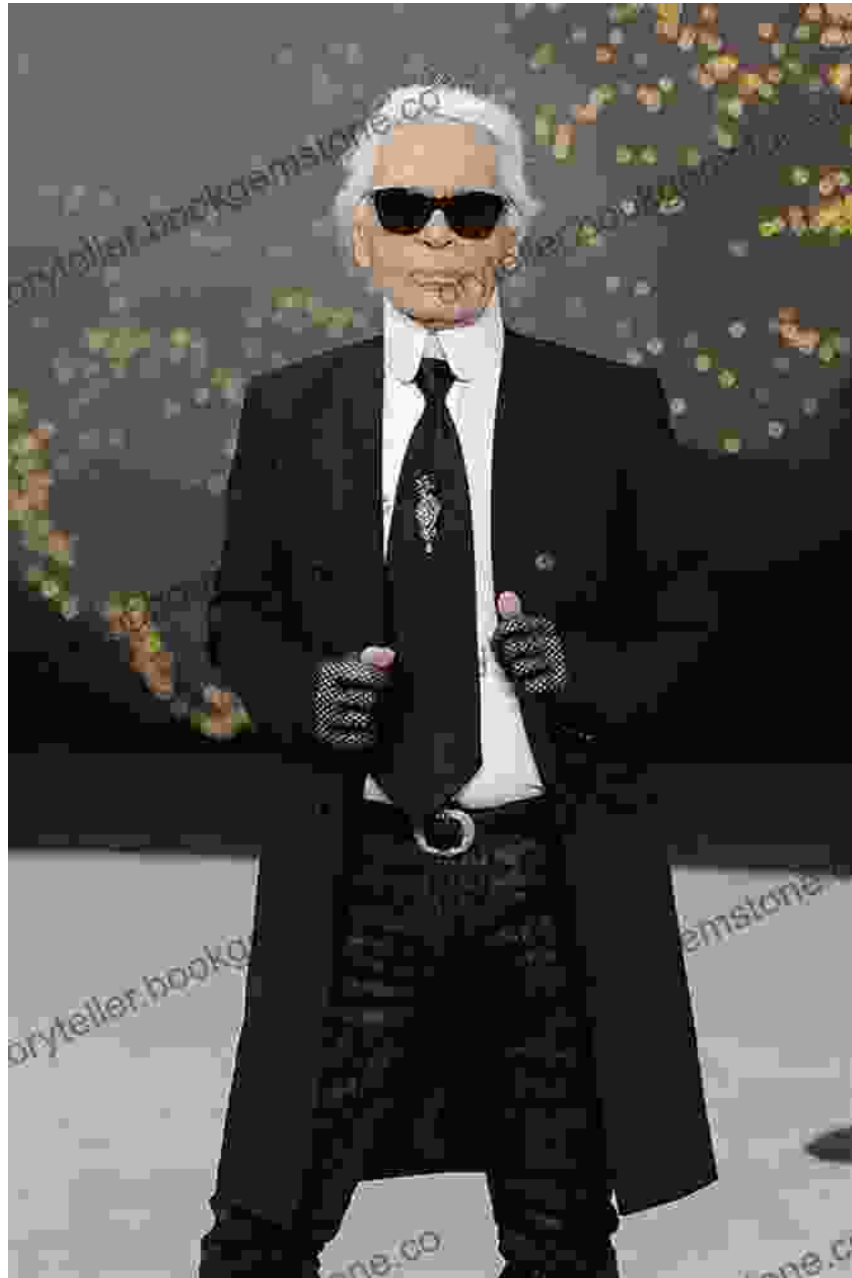
Coco Chanel: The Revolutionary Designer
