Week 60: The Joy of Service

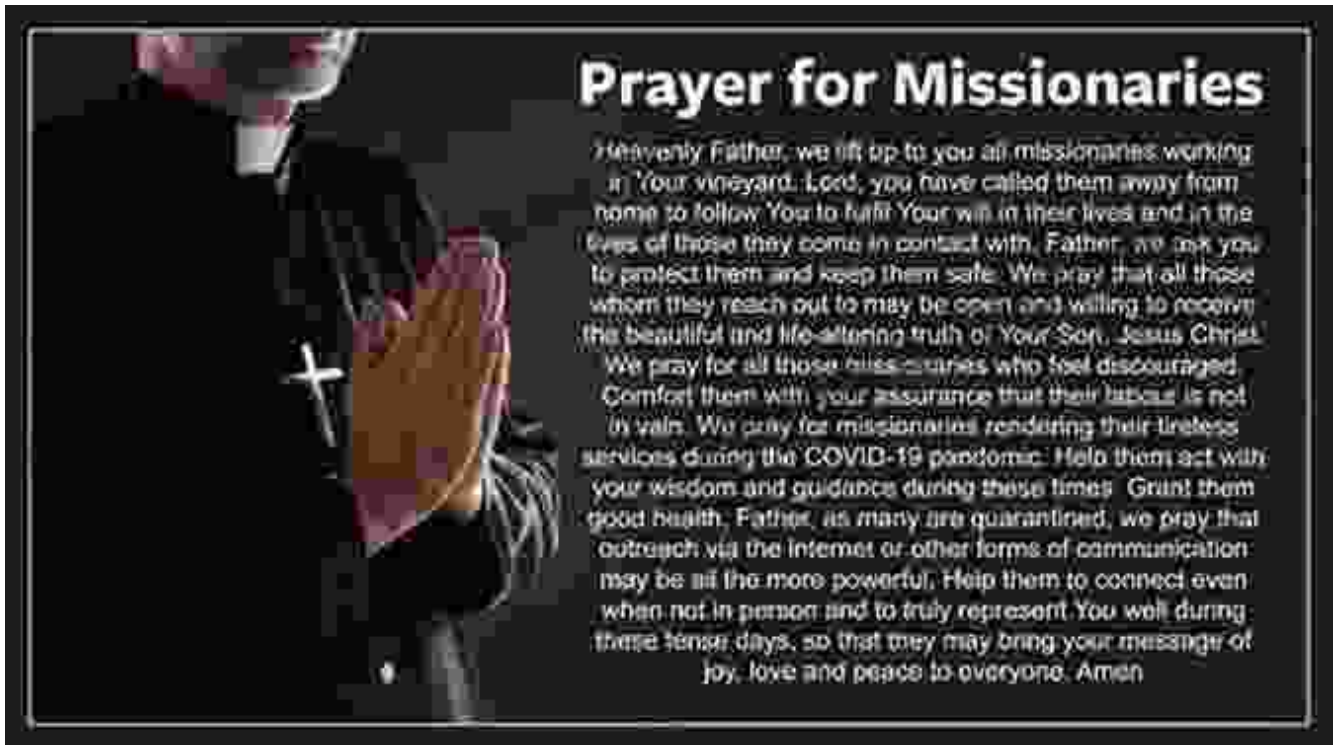


> Oh, the joy of service, > A blessing from above. > We give our time, our talents, our hearts, > Sharing God's love.
